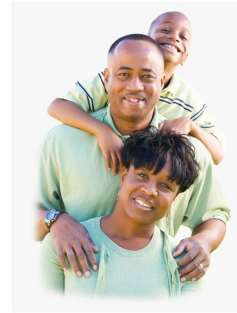

Communication about Student Learning

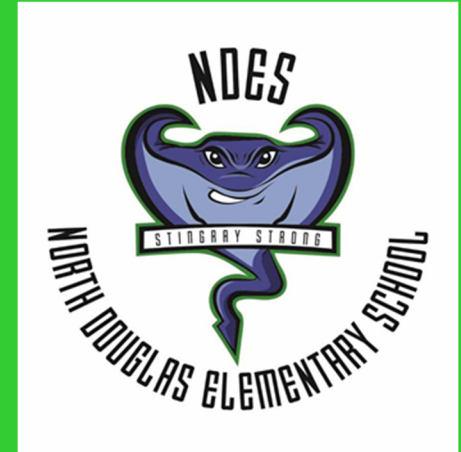
North Douglas Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you include the following:

IN OUR FOURTH GRADE CLASSROOM

The fourth grade teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading, writing, and math in the following ways:

- ⇒ Provide strategies to help build comprehension and fluency.
- ⇒ Connect reading, writing, and math vocabulary to real world situations.
- ⇒ Provide a variety of resources to help with math fact fluency.
- ⇒ Provide links to a variety of resources families can utilize such as online activities through Remind and Google Classroom.
- ⇒ Communicate with parents using Remind and weekly “Stingray Express” folders.
- ⇒ Offer events and resources through our Parent Resource Center that address content related to math, reading, science and social studies throughout the year.

AT HOME

North Douglas Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- ⇒ Read and communicate with my child to help build comprehension and fluency using strategies that are sent home several times per week
- ⇒ Have conversations about the world around us in order to make connections to reading, writing, and math vocabulary.
- ⇒ Practice math facts for fluency with my child using resources provided by the teacher until mastery.
- ⇒ Practice online activities provided through Remind.
- ⇒ Try to utilize events and resources that are offered or get information from the Parent Resource Center if unable to attend.
