It is also sent home with all students at the beginning of the school year along with the Douglas County School District Parent Involvement Plan and the School-Parent Compact. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent and Family Engagement Center.

All parents are encouraged to visit the Parent and Family Engagement Center which is located in the Media Center. Many educational resources are available for parents to check out during the following days and hours.


