Communication about Student Learning


North Douglas Elementary School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you include the following:

AT HOME

North Douglas Elementary School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key at-home activities will be:

- I will have my child read aloud to me least 15 minutes each night and use provided resources to check for fluency and comprehension.
- Utilize math resources to help increase my child's math fluency.
- Check my child's Stingray Express for monthly newsletter to note upcoming reading and math standards and other opportunities.
- Attend parent/teacher conferences to discuss my child's progress towards meeting goals.
- Try to utilize the events and resources that are offered or get information from the Parent Resource Center if unable to attend.
